What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

The Government is encouraging all local communities to produce a Neighbourhood Plan to create a vision of how we'd like our area to develop in the next 10-20 years. A Neighbourhood Plan is about the use of land. It can guide future development, regeneration and conservation in Datchet and will allow us to say, as a community, how we'd like to see any new development (residential, commercial, business), designed and located, and how we'd like our heritage to be safeguarded.

Datchet's Neighbourhood Plan can consider topics which are part of the Local Authority planning process, eg housing, recreation, infrastructure and new facilities. It can't promote less development than the Borough Local Plan and its scope is also limited by the flood zone, Green Belt and Conservation Area. It must also have regard for national policies.

Gathering evidence

As with all planning policies, a Neighbourhood Plan needs to be based on a clear understanding of the place it relates to, and backed by solid evidence. Datchet's Neighbourhood Plan team has already started gathering evidence to support policies which may be included in our Plan. This is a huge task which will take many months. Character assessments will form part of this evidence.

What is a Character Assessment?

A Character Assessment describes the appearance and feel of a place. It considers the key features and characteristics that combine to give an area its unique identity. Good architectural design, that is both attractive and functional, stems from an understanding of the character of the local area. This understanding can help to ensure that new development proposals are of an appropriate design; one that respects and complements the existing local character.
